The City of Beverly Hills is committed to the highest energy efficiency in City facilities. We are seeking a comprehensive approach to achieve a meaningful level of energy cost reduction, in addition to improving the working environment for staff, especially when the cost for such work can be partially or fully offset by incentives.

Based on the experience of the City with EIG over the years, which encompassed standard and innovative approaches to energy efficiency, securing of special incentives, and EIG's single source management of projects, the City is pleased to award EIG with a contract to develop an energy efficiency and conservation strategy for city facilities in connection with the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA), and to also prepare appropriate documentation to submit for participation in California Energy Commission (CEC) and Department of Energy (DOE) competitive grants.
